Copyright Request for Reprints in Licentiate or Ph.D. Theses

Most of the famous and well-known journals and publishers allow you to reprint an article in your licentiate or Ph.D. theses. However, it is always a good idea to apply in advance for the rights to reprint in order to prevent copyright difficulties and to maintain a good relationship between LiU and the journals and publishers.

It is possible for you to check out the journal reprint policies on their website by using a specific link. Some journals and publishers might need a formal mail to the journal/publisher applying for permission of reusing copyright protected material. Usually this process takes a week or two. Make sure to point out that there are no commercial interests what so ever and that you only use the reprinted article in order to get an exam.

How to Find the Permission Link

Most of the publisher and journals have a link to the copyright information but it is sometime difficult to find the link. Often is the link “hidden” behind words like *Request Permission*, *Terms & Conditions*, *Copyright Information* or other words. The example on the next page are using the words *Get rights and contents*.

There are a number of variations and some journals do not have a certain link, so you might have to mail them for permission by using the contact information.

Example 1: Elsevier

The example below (figure 2) demonstrates how to get permissions from a journal in Elsevier using RightsLink Service. Click on *Get rights and contents* (red frame).

Example 2: Taylor & Francis

This example demonstrates how to get permissions from Taylor & Francis (figure 2) using RightsLink Service. Click on *Reprints & Permissions* (1) and then Request permissions (2).

Example from Journals, New Window

It is not necessary creating an account. Note that the article's bibliographic information is visible in the window (figure 3next page). Make the selection *reuse in a thesis/dissertation* and then follow the steps answering the questions. The service is free of charge and you will get an answer directly on the screen.

Make a Reference to the Original Article

When you got the permission reusing the article in your thesis you must make a full reference to the journal/publisher.

On the title page, make a note such as *Published articles have been reprinted with the permission of the copyright holder* or *Articles have been reprinted with permission of the respective copyright owners* or other appropriate wording.

Similarity Check

Use our service *Similarity Check* for checking your thesis against other academic material in order to prevent involuntary plagiarism. The service is free of charge.
